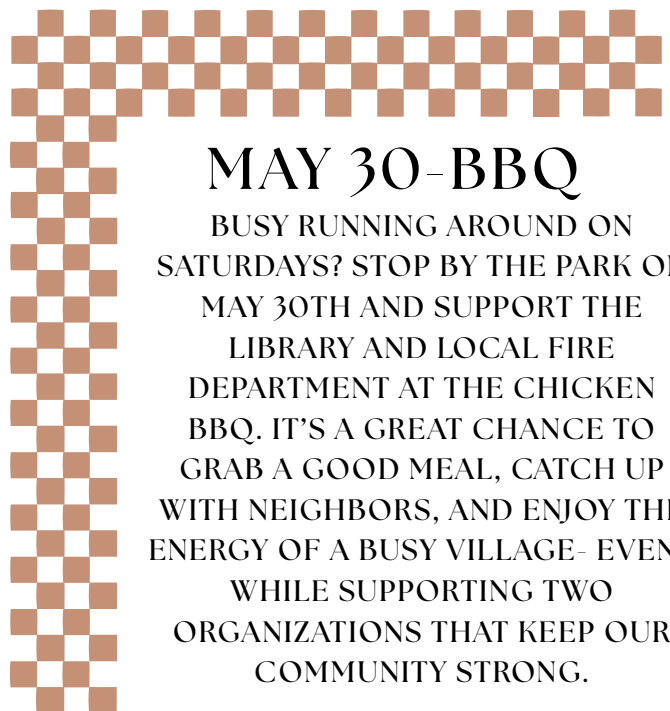
VILLAGE-WIDE YARD SALE - JUNE 6
